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Executive Summary

This document presents a collection of data on the current practice of Units in Higher Education Institutes (HEI) in providing services for students with disability (SwD), including students with learning disabilities, from 73 universities in the European Union and worldwide. The collected data are presented in a consistent way and include the following information for the Unit in each HEI: name, URL, city, country, size, type, policy statement for SwD, name of the Unit, URL of the Unit, the official Mission of the Unit, Committees / Offices for supporting SwD, eligible categories of SwD to get services from the Unit, provided Specific Services for SwD, guidelines / resources for SwD, Assistive Technology provided for SwD, Unit's employees.

Introduction

According to the Edu4ALL proposal, **Task 1.2 «Analysing the current practices of inclusive education for students with disabilities in EU and worldwide»** of the preparatory Work Package WP1 «Reviewing and analysing the educational requirements for people with disabilities in partner countries HEIs » provides input to:

- Task 1.3 «Forming the committee of practice in each institution at both partner countries»
- Task 1.4 «Organising awareness raising workshop on “Inclusive Education in HEIs»
- Task 2.2 «Modernising a 'disability statement' for PC HEIs»
- Task 2.4 «Lab modernisation with the needed assistive technologies at partner country HEIs»
- Task 2.5 «Developing training tutorials»
- Task 2.6 «Defining delivery approaches and assessment».

Thus, this report presents the methodology followed for the data collection, as well as the results of the data collection on the current practices of inclusive education in Higher Education Institutions (HEI) for students with disabilities in the European Union (EU) and worldwide.

Methodology

According to the actions agreed in the kick-off meeting of the Edu4All project, a tele-meeting was held on 12 March 2021 between the partners of WP1 from Palestine and Jordan with the EU partners (UoA, UPV/EHU and Int@E) to discuss the implementation of Task 1.2 and agree on the methodology to be followed.

The methodology includes the following:

- Determination of the data to be collected from each HEI
- Development of the template for data collection
- Selection of the HEI for data collection
- Gathering the data
- Presentation of the data in a report.

After a thorough discussion, we agreed to collect the following data from each HEI:

- **Country of the HEI**
- **Size by providing the number of staff and the students' population**
- **Type of HEI: either public or private**
- **Policy Statement of the HEI for students with disabilities and Learning Educational Needs (LEN)**
- **Unit Name for providing services to students with disabilities & LEN**
- **The URL of the Unit providing services to students with disabilities & LEN**
- **The official Mission of the Unit**
- **Committees / Offices for supporting students with disabilities and LEN**
- **Eligible Categories of students with disabilities & LEN to get services from the Unit**
- **Specific Services for students with disabilities & LEN provided by the Unit**
- **Guidelines / Resources for students with disabilities & LEN**
- **Assistive Technology provided for students with disabilities & LEN**
- **Unit Employees: number and profession of the staff**
